



## Gun Violence in America

Everyday, 100 Americans die from Gun Violence—and many more are injured. What our generation believes is plain and simple: enough is enough. It's time to end gun violence.

### S. 66

*Sen. Feinstein, Dianne [D-CA]*

Makes it a crime to knowingly import, sell, manufacture, transfer, or possess a semiautomatic assault weapon (SAW) or large capacity ammunition feeding device (LCAFD). The prohibition does not apply to a firearm that is (1) manually operated by bolt, pump, lever, or slide action; (2) permanently inoperable; (3) an antique; or (4) a rifle or shotgun specifically identified by make and model.

### S. 1779

*Sen. Richard Blumenthal [D-CT]*

Removes limitations on the civil liability of gun manufacturers. Specifically, the bill repeals the Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act, which prohibits civil actions against a firearm or ammunition manufacturer, seller, importer, dealer, or trade association for damages resulting from the criminal or unlawful misuse of a firearm.

### S.Res. 217

*Sen. Richard J. Durbin [D-IL]*

Expresses support for the designation of June 2019 as National Gun Violence Awareness Month and the designation of June 7-June 9, 2019, as National Gun Violence Awareness Weekend.

### S. 2671

*Sen. Cory A. Booker [D-NJ]*

Provides grant funding to implement coordinated violence reduction initiatives through strategies such as hospital-based violence intervention, evidence-based street outreach, and group violence intervention.

Provides \$65,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2020 through 2029 to the Bureau of Justice Assistance and \$25,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2020 through 2029 to the National Institutes of Health to carry out these programs.

### S.Res. 110

*Sen. Christopher Murphy [D-CT]*

Urges that Federal funds shall not be used to train or arm school personnel with firearms. A resolution to keep guns out of classrooms.

### S. 627

*Sen. Patty Murray [D-WA]*

Promotes the economic security and safety of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking by reauthorizing the National Resource Center Grants on Workplace Responses and entitling safe leave, unemployment compensation, and insurance protections to survivors.
